Here's a fun activity from Learning Without Tears™ for children learning piano and handwriting!



When children have learned all their letters, review the beginning letters of the alphabet: **A, B, C, D, E, F, G,** and **H.**

Show children a piano (or keyboard). Explain that the piano has the beginning letters **A, B, C, D, E, F,** and **G,** but no **H!**



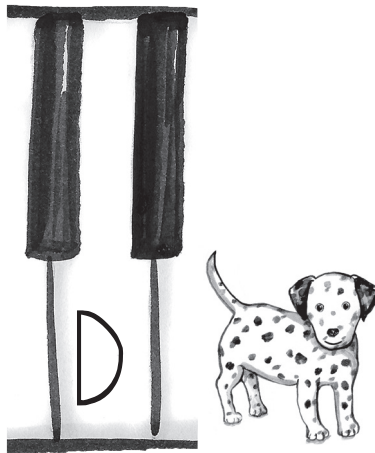
Here is a fun way to find and name the different keys!

D is for doghouse.

There is only room for one dog (or key).
Have children find all the **D**s on the keyboard.

G is for Garage

There are two cars in the garage: **G** and **A**.
Find all the **G**s and **A**s on the keyboard.



Once children know **D, G,** and **A,** they can use alphabetical order figure out all the key names. It's fun to learn piano keys, the beginning of the alphabet, and alphabetical order!
